Course Objectives

In June of 2000, 119 individuals met at the First International Conference on Pediatric Renal Replacement Therapy (PCRRT). This meeting was a great success, attended by nurses and physicians from the areas of pediatric critical care and nephrology. Due to ongoing interest, the Second International Conference on PCRRT has been planned for June, 2002.

The purpose of this conference is to unite in one forum, the international pediatric community involved with pediatric continuous renal replacement therapy. The theme of this meeting is not only an ongoing education on how to perform it, but also an application for everything from SIRS to PCRRT for the treatment of intoxications. By bringing in the area of intoxications, which is commonly an involvement of both critical care and nephrologists, one can identify combination therapies that could utilize detoxifications therapies combined with PCRRT. Further, bringing nurses and physicians together will help each better understand what contributes to the expertise in this field with both the ICU group and the nephrology

This course will feature didactic presentations followed by questions and answers. Abstracts will be submitted for both oral or poster presentation, and this year, fellowship travel awards will be offered for outstanding abstract participants.

All attendees will obtain a copy of the primary speakers' slides on CD ROM for future reference. These slides are considered public domain and therefore can be used for individual education.

Topics to be covered will include

- 1. Practical applications in hemofiltration including solutions, anticoagulation, access, machinery as well as prescription.
- 2. Use of PCRRT in SIRS, hepatic support, intoxications as well as in ARF.
- 3. Specific areas of trouble shooting and nursing intervention on PCRRT.
- 4. Presentation by clinicians involved with specific industry manufactured machinery in order to give a clinician's viewpoint of theses machinery used in PCRRT.

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
